Rio Mesa Center

Objectives

The Rio Mesa banding station is a long-term ornithological study of species composition and population dynamics of Rio Mesa station land bird communities. Through mist-netting and banding birds we will be able to use capture-mark-recapture models that enable us to quantify the long-term changes in the bird community precisely and to measure the increases and declines in the populations, survivorship, productivity, and other demographic parameters of various bird species that comprise the bird community. Our long-term goal is to study how climate change affects the composition of the bird community, through changes in temperature, humidity, water levels, vegetation, bird distributions, and arrival and departure times of migratory birds.

Spring 2014

Spring banding took place April 3rd, 2014 – June 12th, 2014. Head bander: Laura Doll. Banding volunteers: Jason Socci, Christopher Henderson and Jenna McCullough. Sixteen nets were available for banding each day. A total of 280 banding hours and 3,286 net hours were logged. 3 new species were document at the banding site, including Lucy's Warbler, Hooded Oriole, and Mountain Chickadee.

Fall 2014

Fall banding took place August 21st, 2014 – October 9th, 2014. Head bander: Laura Doll. Banding volunteers: Alan Moss and Kaitlin Harrigan. Sixteen nets were available for banding each day. A total of 207.5 banding hours and 3228.5 net hours were logged.

On September 7th, a vegetation survey was conducted near the banding site prior to tamarisk removal, which occurred in mid-September and was conducted by a chainsaw course. Future vegetation surveys will be conducted annually at the start of the fall banding season.

The Western Yellow-billed Cuckoo was listed as a threatened species under the Endangered Species Act on October 3rd, 2014. The Rio Mesa Center may be contained within the 546,335 acres of land that are proposed for designation as critical habitat.
